Coburg Village will be following all guidelines and restrictions set by New York State and the CDC for all future years. Until a determination is made that it is safe to allow our tag sale to be held, unfortunately no future date can be set at this time.

To have a successful sale requires many volunteers, some working throughout the year collecting the donations and sometimes packing them up. Two days before the sale are very busy and require many volunteers. All stored donations are brought to the auditorium, unpacked, sorted for the appropriate tables, arranged and priced. Previous experience in pricing is very helpful. More volunteers are needed the day of the sale and immediately after to clean up which in the past has taken about an hour. Many hands make light work!
